European Commission policy, projects and funding opportunities

It is only 14 years since the EU's third pillar on Justice & Home Affairs was erected and a decade since the establishment of the European Commission Directorate General Justice, Freedom & Security.

The purpose of this information session is to bring EU policy making and practices into sharper focus with the academic community. The ongoing implementation of the 2006-2010 Action Plan to develop an EU Strategy to measure crime and criminal justice demonstrates the European Commission's commitment to stimulate and support EU-level research into crime and criminal justice. Thus, in order to illustrate the shape and purpose of this 2004 Hague programme inspired initiative, the presentation will focus on selected ongoing and planned EU level projects to develop: a classification of criminal offences; a commercial crime survey; a crime researcher web portal; and an EU crime report - to be advertised in 2009.

The final section will serve as a guide to the 2009 Commission annual work programme Security and Safeguarding Liberties in terms of: identified priorities; the various funding instruments, i.e. action grants, operating grants, procurement contracts; and offer (an evaluator's) advice on submitting an application for funding.
